What is Drug Abuse?

What is Drug Abuse?

- Drug abuse is the compulsive (uncontrolled) use of one or more psychoactive (mind-altering) drugs.
- Some common drugs of abuse:
 - Nicotine (cigarettes)
 - Alcohol (beer, wine, liquor)
 - Marijuana
 - Prescription drugs



What is Dependence?

Dependence is the quality or state of being influenced by or needing to have something, either emotionally or physically.



Difference Between Drug Use and Abuse

Frequency

• How often drug use occurs

Amount

How much is taken each time

Dependence

• Whether there is evidence of psychological or physical dependence

Social Attributes

Toward the use of that particular drug.

How Does Drug Abuse Start?

Common Causes of Drug Use

- Desire to fit in with friends who use drugs.
- Inability to resist peer pressure.
- Availability of drugs.
- Attitudes that condone drug use.
- Curiosity about drugs' effects.
- Advertisements (e.g. TV, movies, social media)



How Does Drug Abuse Start?

- The first drugs are usually the ones most available and used by most people (e.g. alcohol and tobacco).
- Next, people may start using other drugs (e.g. marijuana, cocaine).



Where Does Drug Abuse Occur?

- In the beginning, drug use is normally limited to social situations (e.g. parties, hanging out).
- May become a solidarity activity.

Drug Abuse Risk and Effects

Risks and Effects

- Present and future effects on the body (e.g. lung cancer, heart disease).
- Risks for accidents or violence.
- Social and legal problems.



DRUG USE AND VIOLENCE

Causes of Violence

- Alcohol and drug use are associated with a great majority of violent acts.
- Despite what is shown in the media, violence is relatively rare.
- Most people do not carry weapons.
- Most violence arises from everyday conflicts.
